




Partisan Sources Can Be Proble


This week, we kickoff our 50 day countdown until Election Day.




Mail-In Political Plot al Privacy - Terms

A Nonpartisan Campaign

Within 501c3 guidelines, we can:

- Discuss issues
- Advocate for equal access to the ballot

Within 501c3 guidelines, we cannot:

 Endorse candidates or parties **Election** – Voters elect officials and vote on ballot initiatives

Decisions – Elected officials determine policy around issues we care about from racial justice to healthcare to reproductive justice.

Voting Our Jewish Values

"Jewish tradition views government as a human partnership with God. Where Torah predicts that Israelites would want civil rulers instead of priests and prophets, Moses told the people: "[B]e sure to place over yourselves the king that God elects for you" (Deut. 17:14-15). The canon records that God chose the first king, Saul (1 Sam. 9:16-17). The second king, David, was chosen by God but **confirmed** by "all of Israel's elders" (2 Sam. 5:3). The third king, his son Solomon, ruled in David's bloodline but "all the people" together **ratified** his accession (1 Kings 1:39). Given this democratic shift, Talmud opined that not even God could select rulers without consulting the people (B.T. Berachot 55a)."


















COVID Upended Our NJ Election Process for 2020

- 2020 New Jersey Elections
 - May Municipal Non-Partisan Elections (in some New Jersey municipalities)
 - July Primary
 - November General Election
- All three elections became entirely or primarily Vote-by-Mail Elections

2020 General Election How it will work

RECOMMENDED

In Person

- Fewer polling places*
 50% of normal count county wide; at least one per municipality
- Paper (provisional) ballots
 Machine for voters with disabilities
- YOUR OWN Vote-by-mail ballot drop-off
- All standard Covid-19 precautions

By Vote-by-Mail Ballot

- Mail-in ballots mailed <u>automatically</u> to active, registered voters (By October 5)
- 4 ways to return ballots
 - Secure drop boxes*
 - USPS (Postage pre-paid)
 - Polling sites Election Day*
 - Board of Elections offices**

^{*} Voters will be sent poll locations in separate mailing (sent 10/23)

^{**} In person to 300 Halls Mill Rd., Freehold

Who's eligible to register?



- ☐ A U.S. citizen
- ☐ At least 17 years old (But you can not vote until you turn 18)
- ☐ A resident of the county for 30 days before the election
- Not serving a prison sentence for a felony

NEW! You can vote if you are on parole or probation but you need to register—even if you were registered before.





- 7) Registrants who are submitting this form by mail and are registering to vote for the first time: If you do not supply any of the information required by section 7, or the information you provide cannot be verified, you will be asked to provide a COPY of a current and valid photo ID, or a document with your name and current address on it to avoid having to provide identification at the polling place. Note: ID Numbers are Confidential and will not be released by any governmental agency. Any person who uses such numbers illegally shall be subject to criminal penalties.
- 8) If you are homeless, you may complete section 8 by providing a contact point or the location where you spend most of your time. 13) You may declare a political party affiliation or you may declare to be unaffiliated, regardless of any prior party affiliation. If you are a
- previously affiliated voter who wants to change political party affiliation or become unaffiliated, you must file this form no later than 55 days before the primary election in order to vote in the primary election. DEADLINES

Postmarked 21 days before Election Day (October 13)

Once registered, you stay registered and do not need to submit another form unless you change your *address*, *name*, *signature*, or *party affiliation*.



How to vote by mail




You'll receive a package in the mail. It contains your ballot and two envelopes.



Fill in the circles on the ballot to mark your choices. Use a blue or black pen—not pencil or marker. The ballots are scanned by machine.

Put the ballot in the certification envelope.

Do not detach or damage the flap!




Complete the information on the outside of the smaller envelope and *sign*.



Place the certification envelope in the outer envelope and seal. *It is self-addressed and stamped.*




Are vote-by-mail ballots safe?

The data makes the case

- Since 2000, 250 million mail-in ballots cast; 143 criminal convictions for election fraud
- Five states (CO, HI, OR, UT, WA) use vote-by-mail primarily;
 few- to-no fraud cases

Safeguards are in place

- Identity verification
- Bar codes
- Secure Drop Boxes
- Harsh penalties
- Post-election audits (statistical anomalies)



New Jersey Keeps Improving

July Election

 2.8% of voted ballots were rejected November Election

 Goal: 0% of voted ballots rejected


May Election

 9.6% of voted ballots were rejected

You will be notified automatically by mail if your ballot is rejected.



New Stuff

- This is a paper ballot election (primarily vote by mail)
- New Jersey has online voter registration for the first time – please share this far and wide!!!
- Unless I have a disability that requires me to vote on a machine, I cannot vote on a machine in the 2020 General Election
- I can vote a provisional ballot on Election Day +
- I have 4 ways to return my Vote By Mail Ballot – only one depends on USPS
- VOTE EARLY!!!!







We Have So Much Potential

- URJ Congregations are located in 27 of 40 NJ Legislative Districts
- Congregants who have taken action with RAC-NJ live in 34 of 40 legislative districts
- 15,000 families in legislative districts across the state have potential to make us heard as Jews in Trenton


